meeting place for tourists.




The sweetest surprise for Marc and

Its area is 136 hectares big and located on the edge of Trojmiejski Park. It started to work in 1954.


In the zoo there are animals from all continents. Here we can watch the species which don't exist in wildlife any more like antelope Bongo. There are more than thousand animals.

Looking for the dove we get to the Executioner's House.




Today there is the Dialogue Theatre, but once there lived a real
